A seminar by George and Nancy Egger, to let you reach out and touch that multidimensional intersection where Science, Religion, Magic, and Mystery join together to form the fabric of Reality.

- Day One: ‘Real’ alchemists and alchemy deal with transformations and in transmutation--and gold IS very important to alchemists. (Though the reason WHY will surprise you...)
 - But intent is everything--so stop right now and ask yourself a question: if you can learn to transform just ONE thing in yourself and ONE thing in the world, what will those things BE?
 - And are you willing to learn to see the universe a bit differently, in order to obtain that power?
 - Day One explores four of the major rules of alchemy, how to apply them, and then illustrates that by making and using several major alchemical tools in a transformational ceremony.
- AND
- Day Two: Explore the science and art of brewing potions, learn how and why they are used in ceremonial work, then apply this knowledge by brewing a potion and using it in healing ceremony.
 - Potions differ from other herbal preparations in that the ingredients are selected for both their spiritual and their physical properties but only rarely for their physiological properties. They are assembled in a ceremonial manner, used in a manner that combines symbolism with intent to synergize their effects.

This workshop is for people open to exploring a way to find, within yourself and the universe, the path of transformation. The techniques are simple, and different enough that no previous experience of any kind is needed—just an open mind and the willingness to let yourself see the world with new eyes. The class is experiential in nature.
